DIVISION I

HORTICULTURE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All horticulture specimens must be fresh plant materials grown by the exhibitor.
2. All specimens must be named, giving genus and species when these are not already in the schedule: variety/cultivar added when available; common name may be added.
3. Exhibitors may make more than one entry per class or sub-class, if each is a different genus, species, variety/cultivar, type, size or color.
4. Container grown plants must have been in exhibitor's possession at least 90 days, except for multiple plantings, which must have been in exhibitor's possession at least 6 weeks.
5. Scales of points for judging Horticulture in Handbook for Flower Shows, Section VI.

DIVISION II

DESIGN RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Emphasis in this show will be on fresh and/or dried plant material. No artificial plant material, flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables are permitted.
2. Fresh plant material may not be treated in any manner.
3. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit.
4. All plant material must be listed on a 3"x 5" card provided by the exhibitor. A brief explanation of the design may be included on the card.
5. Judges are requested to write comments.
6. An exhibitor may enter as many classes or sub-classes as desired, but only one exhibit per class or sub-class is allowed.
7. Landscapes or scenes are not permitted in Design Division.
8. The following are permitted unless by schedule or law: Accessories, featured objects, treated dried materials, contrived flowers and other forms made of real plant material, fresh or dried, cut fruit or vegetables (MUST be sealed unobtrusively to discourage insects, odor, discoloration), objects which add interest when tastefully used (e.g. feathers, nests, coral, sponges, sea fans, shells, bones, antlers, horns, starfish, special lighting, and living plants with roots attached (e.g., leek, bromeliad, moss).
9. Scale of Points for judging Designs in Handbook for Flower Shows, Section VI.
10. FFGC/FDS Students are encouraged to exhibit designs.

Section D. Arboreal – “All Decked Out”

Fresh cut branches from evergreen or deciduous shrubs or trees (hardwood perennial) grown for the beauty of foliage, flowers or fruit or cone. Specimens not to exceed 30” in length, nor be shorter than 12”. If a miniature or dwarf plant, a specimen sufficient in length to show habit of growth (2 nodes).

OVERSIZED, TOP HEAVY SPECIMENS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Section E. Cut Decorative Foliage – “Bashful Beauties”

Most generally, but not limited to, leaves or branchlets of tropicals or exotics. Those pieces of horticulture which are not trees or shrubs and which might be useful in design or are grown for their own beauty or distinction. *OVERSIZED, TOP HEAVY SPECIMENS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED* (i.e. Sago Palm, Elephant Ear, *Alocasia*, Rice plant).

DIVISION II DESIGN

“Spring Holidays”

“BEST IN SHOW” Award can be offered in this Division – All plant material used must be listed on 3” x 5” card. Designers’ showboards will be 36” high. Color of showboard is designer’s choice unless otherwise noted.

Class 1. MUST HAVE FOUR ENTRIES

- A. “The Luck of the Irish” – All plant material must be fresh. Design must be all green and staged in front of a yellow showboard. Design to be staged on a 3’w x 2’d section of tabletop draped in black.
Table 30” from the floor.

Class 2. MUST HAVE FOUR ENTRIES

- A. “Celebrate Easter” – All fresh plant material.
Design to be staged on a 3’w x 2’d section of tabletop draped in black.
Table 30” from the floor.

Class 3. MUST HAVE FOUR ENTRIES

- A. “Mother’s Day” – Exhibition Table, Type I – Designer must use an Accessory or a Featured Object - Designer’s Choice
Design to be staged on a 3’ w x 2’ d section of tabletop draped in black.
Table 30” from the floor.

Class 4. MUST HAVE FOUR ENTRIES

- A. “Memorial Day – Remembering our Military” – Patriotic Theme. Designer’s Choice
Designer has choice of fresh and/or dried plant materials and other components. Design to be staged in front of a dark blue showboard on a 3’ w x 2’ d section of tabletop draped in black.
